Welcome to Summer School

Trinity School for Seniors offers a casual three week 'Summer School' program during the January school holidays which provides the perfect opportunity to try out a variety of classes that you might not normally consider during term time.

To participate in Summer School activities, please complete an enrolment form to reserve your place in your preferred classes. **Enrolment forms will be made available and accepted for enrolment, from Monday 11th November 2024.** There is limited availability based on the size of each classroom and thus it is imperative that participants book to reserve their spot.

The fee structure for Summer School is a **\$2 donation per class**, payable to your tutor on arrival to theclass.Thereareafewclasses that incur an additional fee, payable to TSFS Reception prior to your attendance. Vicarious Adventures in Europe, Part 1 with Rita and Rob Phillips and Peter Waller

When Rita's Dad Peter was doing his apprenticeship in Switzerland, one of his colleagues walked from the north to the south of Switzerland. Ever since then, Peter had been wanting to do that walk; but he only talked about it. When he was 80, he raised it again, and Rita told him "It's now or never" and she offered to organise it.

The hike is a 250km route from Basel (in the relatively -flat, German-speaking north) to Chiasso (in the mountainous, Italian-speaking south). It is one of six Swiss National hiking routes. We arrived in Switzerland in August 2012 (when Peter was just 82), and spent 21 days hiking south over the 2100m high Gotthard Pass, and then made our way 'downhill' to the Italian border. After all the ups and downs along the way, we climbed the equivalent of Mt Everest.

We will tell you our stories about the natural beauty of this landscape through Rita's photos, and also about some of the experiences we had.

History Alive with Susie King

Three 'Rs' in History (Part 2)

Reformation and Restoration

These movements were to have an impact on the Western World that was to resonate for hundreds of years. They changed and challenged our cultural, scientific, religious and political thinking and helped to create the 'modern era'. Why did these events occur? What were their short and long-term consequences?

Session 1: The Reformation (circa 16th and 17th Centuries)

The Roman Catholic Church was being challenged in the Middle Ages and well before the advent of Martin Luther. Where and why did these challenges occur? The divisions and sects which originated in the Protestant Reformation are still with us today and have had a major impact in wars and power struggles throughout the world.

Session 2: The Restoration (1660 – 1688)

England, and later Britain, had laid the foundations for limiting the power of the monarchy since Magna Carta in 1215. Find out more about the steps towards a Constitutional Monarchy culminating in the Restoration of Charles II in 1660 and the Glorious Revolution of 1688. As the British Empire expanded so too did the principles of democracy and Constitutional Monarchy.





Introducing Offshore Wind with Professor Britta Bienen

This presentation will give in introduction to harnessing renewable energy from offshore wind. A brief background provides the global context of the offshore wind industry and its evolution, with Australia representing one of the emerging markets. The talk will also provide a high level overview of aspects involved in planning and constructing an offshore wind farm, before first power is obtained. Some of these aspects will be discussed in more detail, with links explained to ongoing research at the University of Western Australia.

Professor Britta Bienen is based at the Centre for Offshore Foundations Systems within the School of Earth and Oceans at the University of Western Australia.
